CHRISTIANS AS AGENTS AND MISSIONARIES OF HOPE



On Thursday, 9th May 2024, a great event took place during Solemn Vespers at St Peter's Basilica in Rome; it was the Solemn Proclamation of the Jubilee Year 2025 by Pope Francis with the Bull of Indiction entitled - **Spes non confundit** (Hope does not disappoint) which ties-in with the theme of the Jubilee Year 2025 - Pilgrims of Hope. According to Pope Francis in that Bull, "In the heart of each person, hope dwells as the desire and expectation of good things to come, despite our not knowing what the future may bring." Pope Francis reminds us that we are hopeful because of Christ who is our hope; hence, in all the vicissitudes of life, we should always look out for the signs of hope around us such as the desire for peace, the openness to and the preservation of life at all stages, the rehabilitation of prisoners, the compassion shown to the sick, the vitality of young people, care for migrants, the profundity of grandparents and the eradication of poverty in our world. Pope Francis then reminded all Christians that the Jubilee Year 2025 would be the 1700th Anniversary of the celebration of the first Ecumenical Council of Nicaea which preserved the unity of the Church and gave us the Nicene Creed. The Pope encouraged all Churches and Ecclesial Communities to find fitting ways to respond fully to the prayer of Christ "That they may all be one." It is that Priestly Prayer of Christ that we are presented with in our Sunday Gospel.

Here in Fleet and Church Crookham, one way we respond to the above prayer of Jesus is our Unity Service. This year, it will be held on Sunday 19th May at 6.30pm at Christ Church, Crookham, Gally Hill Road, GU52 6LH. Let us come together as God' sons and daughters whom He loves equally. Fr Johnpromise
