

PROFOUND APPRECIATION TO FR PETER HART





THERE ARE NO CROSSLESS CHRISTIANS

In my last meeting with my Spiritual Director before embarking on the Canonical Retreat that led to my priestly ordination, he focused on a topic that sends shivers down my spine each time I think about it - MY DEATH ON THE DAY OF MY PRIESTLY ORDINATION. My Spiritual Director made it clear to me that as I prostrated on the floor of St John's Cathedral Portsmouth while the entire heavenly source invoked on me during the Litany of the Saints I courts were invoked on me during the Litany of the Saints, died to self, signed off my life and began a new life in and with Christ. According to him, after that incident, I would never lay any other claim on my life since it belongs to never lay any other claim on my life since it belongs to God, His Church, and His people even to the point of sacrificing it to defend them all. You can imagine the horror I felt when in his homily at my Priestly Ordination on the 20th of July 2019, Bishop Philip Egan echoed the above words of my Spiritual Director when he said: "The priesthood will cost you everything, even your own life." Based on my experiences the past 4 years as a priest, I can testify that the above statement is simply the truth. The priesthood and indeed the Christian life in general are very costly; no wonder Dietrich Bonhoeffer in his classic - The Cost of Discipleder Dietrich Bonhoeffer in his classic - The Cost of Discipleship, reminds us that we do pay a huge price when we fol-low Christ the right way. It is this cost of discipleship that we encounter in today's readings.

When the Lord called Jeremiah to be His mouthpiece to the people of Israel, he was reluctant due to the enormity of the tasks involved. Because of the being a prophet, he was ridiculed, maltreated, chained, and lost the contact and comfort of his close friends. In today's Gospel, Peter wanted Christ to abandon His destiny since the same Peter had confessed Christ to be the Anointed One last week; however, Christ rebuked him in anger but went on to educate us on the real Cost of Discipleship. To be His disciple, we must Renounce (*Aparneomai* - Deny and Forget) ourselves; Take up (Airo - Bear and Willing Accept) our Cross/es and Follow (Akoloutheo - To follow in the exact footsteps of one who proceeds) Him. None of these things are easy at all, that is why we all rely on the Mercy of God as St Paul tells us in today's Second Reading. Even in this 21st Century, Christians are still being persecuted throughout the world and here in Great Britain. Is it possible there are people in our parish who are persecuted for following Christ as they are? No cross no matter how small is sweet; however, we should not carry them alone. Are we ready to surrender them to Jesus? He is the only one who can give us the grace the carry the so many crosses of our lives without breaking down under the heavy load. Yes, the Cost of Discipleship is too expensive.

I AM HERE TO LOVE AND TO SERVE ALL OF YOU

I am Fr Johnpromise Ikenna Umeozuru, originally from Nigeria but a citizen of Great Britain. Born on the 1st of May 1982 in Aba town Nigeria, and into the family of Mr Marcel and Mrs Elizabeth Umeozuru of Umuchu village in Anambra State, Nigeria. I have five other siblings: four brothers and one sister. I felt the call to the priesthood at the age of 7 through the exemplary life of my then parish priest in Nigeria - Late Mgr Raph Nwosu. I entered the minor seminary when I was 11 years old and after 19 years of seminary formation in Nigeria, Rome and England, the amiable Bishop Philip Egan ordained me a priest on the 20th of July 2019. My long stint in the seminary led to my graduating with a B.A Hons in Philosophy from University of Ibadan Nigeria, a B.Phil and B.STh respectively from Pon-tifical Urban University Rome, a B.Tec from Interna-tional School of Business Studies London and an MBA from Cardiff Metropolitan University Wales. After my priestly ordination, I worked in Jersey for 2 years as an Assistant Priest under Canon Dominic Golding. In 2021, I was transferred to City Centre Southampton Parish for 2 years as an Assistant Priest under Mgr Canon Vincent Harvey. Before joining the diocese of Portsmouth, I worked full time for 7 years as a deputy manager in a residential care home in London, and part time as a qualified Assessor/Tutor within the Health and Social Care Sector in England. My hobbies include: gyming, jogging, running, singing, cooking, movies, meditation, long walks, travelling, reading, and writing, arts, making friends and critical thinking.

I am here to love and to serve all of you. I am a strong believer in the 3 Principles of Divine Renovation - BE-LONG, BELIEVE, BEHAVE. It is only when people feel they Belong to a welcoming, loving, merciful and for-giving community that they would Believe in what that community tells them and then model their Behaviours on the community's principles. For the next few years, I would like all of us to focus on BELONGING. Yes, let us make Fleet and Church Crookham a WELCOMING HUB for all peoples be they practicing or lapsed Catholics, Christians of various denominations, people of other faiths and those of none. This is the first principle of Jesus Christ - He met people where they were, and He continues to meet us where we are. Let everyone who comes into our 2 churches find a welcoming, loving, merciful and forgiving community.
