# Jesus Welcomes The Outsiders

In his book - Pope Francis: Untying the Knots, Paul Vallely told the story of an encounter Pope Francis had while he was a parish priest in Argentina. One of his female parishioners who was a single mother and could not find work, was known to be trading herself as a means of survival and to feed her children. When Pope Francis (Fr Jorge Bergoglio as he was) heard of that, he asked the woman to meet him. The woman was very nervous since she was aware everyone knew what she was doing and was petrified she would be told off by the priest. When Pope Francis met her, he gave her a hug and called her **Senora**. He then gave her a parcel he had asked Caritas to put together for her and an offer for employment to get her off the streets. The woman was visibly moved and cried excessively. Afterwards, she told Pope Francis she was moved that he treated her as a normal person and addressed her officially as Senora, instead of a lowly and filthy person. For that reason, she turned her back to her trade and straightened her life. It is this being one with outsiders both in the Church and in the society that we encounter in today's readings.

During the time of Christ, lepers were outsiders, outlaws and outcasts of the society. They were only allowed to live on the outskirts of towns and villages as we encounter in today's First Reading and the Gospel. However, it is with such outcasts that Christian mingled interested. They were this friends they have the content of the content o and interacted. They were His friends, they approached Him freely, He touched them personally and lived with them. Who are the outcasts of today? I think of the LGBT Community who have faced lots of condemnation from the Church; I think of individuals living with Mental Health illness who have been failed by our society. Like Christ, you and I are called to reach out to them and touch them. Fr Johnpromise

### THE HOLY SEASON OF LENT COMMENCES




