HAVE YOU ANYTHING HERE TO EAT?



One of the hobbies which I indulge in whenever I can is visits to museums to get acquainted in the history and culture of people around the world. When I was in Geneva, I visited their Museum of Arts and History and was thrilled by the exhibitions therein. While going through the paintings that mean so much to them, I was struck by the painting above as it was displayed side-by-side; it was equally the first time I had come into contact with it. Initially, my religious sensitivity found it revolting and I wanted to ignore it; however, my curiosity overpowered me and I decided to read the description beside it. My discovery threw me off balance. The painting above is referred to as either Roman Charity or Cimon and Pero and recorded in the 'Nine Books of Memorable Deeds and Sayings', by the great ancient Roman historian - Valerius Maximus.

It is the story of a hungry man who stole a loaf of bread to feed his starving family, but was caught and sentenced to death by starvation. The man's daughter who had recently given birth begged the authorities to allow her an hour of visit to her dad each day. Since the breastfeeding mother was not allowed to bring anything for her dad and fearing he would die of starvation, fed him with her breastmilk. She was caught and imprisoned but her dedication to and affection for her dad were so moving that both were freed and the family provided for out of public funds for the rest of their lives. On this 3rd Sunday of Easter, we are invited to look at the wounds of loneliness, hurt, isolation, hunger and thirst of people around us and touch them by providing for their needs as the disciples provided for Christ.
