WEARING THE RIGHT WEDDING GARMENT

While growing up in Nigeria with my siblings, we had two sets of clothes; the first set was the ordinary day-to-day clothing we wore at home and while playing with our friends as they were hand downs from our older siblings. The second set of clothes was our SUNDAY FINEST which we wore to Mass on Sundays, when playing hosts to important guests in our family and when going to visit wealthy relatives. My parents gave us various rules and regulations regarding our Sunday Finest - They must not be worn without their permission, they must always be properly folded, hung up and wrapped as on the day they were bought; while wearing them, we must desixt from all dirt, and finally, when they were dirty, they must be given to mum who alone had the requisite training to wash them fittingly. As a young man, I treasured my Sunday Finest because they were not only adorable, but they were also tailored to fit my physique. Each time mum and dad asked us to put on our Sunday Finest, we knew that was a big occasion and we looked forward to it with profound excitement.

In our Sunday Readings of this week, we are reminded of the importance of wearing our Sunday Finest to the wedding banquet the Lord is preparing for us. In the First Reading from Isaiah 25, we are informed that this banquet would be made up of fine strained wines, with rich and juicy food. In the Gospel from Matthew 22, we are reminded that although everyone is invited (Kaleo - Summoned/Called) to this wedding banquet, there is only one prerequisite - Everyone must wear Enduma Gamos - 'A Proper Wedding Banquet Outer Garment'. This proper wedding banquet outer garment does not need to be from Gucci, Louis Vuitton, Balenciaga, Versace, Burberry, and the like; however, it must be an expensive garment made up of our charitable deeds to all peoples without discrimination nor demarcations, for charity is the form, mover, mother, and root of all the virtues according to St Thomas Aquinas.
