THE PATRON SAINT OF IRELAND AND NIGERIA



If this Sunday wasn't the 5th Sunday of Lent, we would have been celebrating the Solemnity of St Patrick. He was born in Roman Britain around 387 AD, when he was around 14 years old, he was captured by Irish pirates during a raiding party and taken to Ireland as a slave. Although Ireland was a land of Druids and pagans at the time, upon his escape back to Britain, he saw a vision wherein he was appealed to go back to Ireland and save souls. That led him to the priesthood; he was later ordained a Bishop and sent to preach the Gospel in Ireland. In Ireland, he was a Missionary Bishop who preached the Gospel by concentrating on educating the local chieftains and their families. He ordained many priests, divided the country into dioceses, and founded monasteries.

In following the great footsteps of St Patrick, when Nigeria was under the British Empire and the Eastern part of Nigeria (which is where I come from) was in need of evangelisation, Bishop Joseph Shanahan born in Tipperary in 1871, was consecrated and sent to us in 1902 to evangelise us. He was so humble, loved the people, and worked tirelessly for them by providing them with education, healthcare and other social services. To ensure the work of evangelisation continued in Nigeria, Bishop Shanahan invited the Holy Ghost Fathers and St Patrick's Missionaries, who brought God and civilisation to the people. St Patrick Missionaries went further by appealing to Irish Catholics to send money to Nigeria for the education of babies there; I am one of the beneficiaries of their generosity. I have a very soft spot for Irish people for all their sacrifices for us. Yes, in Nigeria, Guinness is the official beer as it is the case in Ireland. Happy Solemnity to all our Irish parishioners. PASTORAL LETTER FROM BISHOP PHILIP: Bishop Philip has written a Pastoral Letter on the importance of REGULAR CONFESSIONS, to be read at all Sunday Masses this weekend in our Diocese of Portsmouth.

OUR PARISH LENT PENITENTIAL SERVICE: To help us prepare adequately for Easter, our Lent Penitential Service comes up on Wednesday, 20th March 2024 at 7pm at Holy Trinity Church Crookham. Other priests from our Pastoral Area would be helping out with our individual confessions. Let us utilise this opportunity.

PARISH FINANCE UPDATE: Having completed the first half of the parish year (Sept to Feb) I am pleased to say that our income is doing quite well. Total income to 29th Feb 2024 was £91,813.51, expenditure, £85,944.00 with a surplus of £5,869.51. The average STO Giving is approx. £3.3k pm, Envelopes £1k pm, and Cash £1.7k pm with the benefit of a Gift Aid Tax reclaim to end of Dec 2023 of £8.3k. Hall hire brings in £3.2k pm, with income from rental of Our Lady's Presbytery, £1.1k pm. The average monthly running costs for the Church, Office & Presbytery is £14.3K (30% of planned budget for the full year). The Parish overall balances are £42k in credit. Within the second half of the year there will be significant expenditure for repair works on the Church heating systems, but this expenditure is within the budget. Thank you all for your giving to the parish by whichever means you use.
