# THE WORD OF GOD IS ALWAYS GOOD NEWS



Before our Christmas festivities, I was invited to talk to some young people who were 8 years and above. For my opening discussion with them, I chose one of the popular stories in the Bible — The Parable of the Prodigal Son. When I asked how many of them knew the story or had heard about it, I was shocked to the core of my being to learn that none of them knew the story or had heard about it. I felt compassion for them that they are missing out on those wonderful stories that my mum and dad shared with me while I was growing up. As a young boy, one of the gifts my parents gave each of us was 'A Children's Bible' with pictures that illustrated the key stories in both the Old and New Testaments. Before going to bed each night, mum and dad gathered us together for a family night prayer, which always began with either of them reading a story to us from the Children's Bible. When we learnt how to read properly, mum and dad drew up a reading rota amongst us théir 6 kids. I can still picture my Children's Bible in my mind's eyes, and how worn-out it became over the years.

On this 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time which Pope Francis instituted as THE SUNDAY OF THE WORD OF GOD, with his 2019 *Motu Proprio — Aperuit Illis*, we are encouraged to take up regular reading of the Bible to encounter the God who speaks to us in the same way He asked Jonah to preach repentance to the people of Nineveh in our First Reading. One thing is certain, our regular reading of the Word of God will lead us to "Repent and believe the Good News," as Christ proclaimed in our Gospel Reading. Yes, the Bible is the Good News of God.
