MY GOD AND MY CONSCIENCE

Catholic Conscience The Soice of the heart.

One of the many foolish things we did as young seminarians in Nigeria, was to apportion nicknames to people based on our perception of them. The 2nd Rector during my Major Seminary training in Nigeria was a very conscientious man who was diligent with his formative duties. Each time we had the Rector's Conference, he always concluded it with these words: My God and My Conscience would bear me witness that I have told you the truth. Before long, we nicknamed him, 'My God and My Conscience'. Whenever any of us sighted him from a long way away, one of us would shout out - My God and My Conscience; that was enough information to everyone around to be on their best behaviour. This priest was so assiduous with his duties that after one term as the Rector of our seminary, he was appointed a Bishop. On the day the seminary bade him farewell, he gave a speech that brought tears to everyone; he concluded his farewell speech by stating that his conscience was clear before God that he never led any of us stray, that he was ready to stand before God and give an account of his stewardship. It is this same clear conscience that we hear of in our readings this Sunday.

In our Second Reading from 1John Chapter 3, we are reminded that if our conscience does not condemn us, then we do not need to be afraid of God's presence; this is because our conscience is God's messenger who speaks to us behind a veil, as St John Henry Newman stated. However, for us to obey our conscience and be at peace with God, we need to form our conscience with the Word of God, the Teachings of the Church, Prayer, and the advise of wise people. By so doing, we remain faithful branches and inextricably attached to Christ who is the Vine. **Fr Johnpromise**
