

SPEAKING/TEACHING WITH AUTHORITY



When Bishop Philip came back from his Study Leave, he called and checked up on me to know how I was fairing in Fleet and Church Crookham. During that telephone conversation, we agreed to meet in January. On Monday, 22nd January 2024, I had a one-toone meeting with Bishop Philip here in Fleet. The meeting lasted for 2 and half hours; we ended up at Bella Capri for supper which the Bishop graciously paid for. During our meeting, I gave the Bishop an account of my stewardship so far, and informed him of the wonderful welcome, support, care and love I have received and continue to receive from our parishioners. I informed him of the pains and hurts of the last few years, and the fact we are all healing together and enjoying a New Dawn in our parish. The Bishop listened attentively to me, empathised with our situation, advised me on how to be better in my ministry and asked me to convey his paternal closeness to all our parishioners. The next day been Tuesday, in a short ceremony witnessed by Fr John Chadwick (The Dean of our Deanery), in front of the Blessed Sacrament, with my hands on the Book of the Gospels, I made the Profession of Faith and took the Oath of Fidelity, as the constituted Parish Priest of Fleet and Church Crookham, with the authority to teach what the Church teaches and not my thoughts.

On this 4th Sunday, we are reminded that our authority to minister to others comes from Christ. However, for us to be relevant in this modern age, we must live out what we teach. As one of our parishioners reminded me, it seems all the Church wants the Laity to do is to Pray, Pay and Obey; that time has changed, all the ministers of the Church MUST live, and minister like Christ. **Fr Johnpromise**

PARISH FINANCE UPDATE: Over the 4-month period (Sept to Dec) income is slowly increasing. Total Income to 31st Dec 2023 was £48,836.74 and expenditure was £49,083.75 - a small loss of £247.00. The average Standing Order Giving is just over £2.96k pm (per month) with Envelopes approx. £1k pm and Cash £1.6k pm. Hall hire brings in £2.77k pm with rental of Our Lady's Presbytery bringing in £1.14k pm. Further income sources include a regular contribution from the Polish Community and going forward we will benefit from parish social events. The average monthly running costs for the Church, Office & Presbytery is £12.25k. In the next few months, we will incur some significant expenditure with boiler upgrades, but this is within the budget. The parish overall account balances are £47k credit. Thank you all for your giving to the parish by whichever means you use. Do please ensure that you have signed a **CDP Gift Aid Form**. The Finance Committee is presently reviewing the future of the Centenary Fund; we will make our findings known to you all. 
