NO ONE LOVES ME!!! - A PETRIFYING CRY!

Mother Teresa of Calcutta became a known figure because of her love for humanity especially the poorest and those on the margins of society. Her love for the poor was so profound and infectious that even while she was alive, she was dubbed THE SAINT OF THE SLUMS. Among the many thought-provoking sayings of Mother Teresa of Calcutta, there is one that has had a profound effect on me and stays at my bedside. It is this: "At the end of life we will not be judged by how many diplomas we have received, how much money we have made, how many great things we have done. We will be judged by -I was hungry, and you gave me something to eat, I was naked, and you clothed me. I was homeless, and you took me in." The above statement of Mother Teresa of Calcutta in the 20th Century was summarised in the 16th Century by St John of the Cross thus: "In the evening of life, we will be judged on LOVE ALONE." It is this greatest, all-embracing but new commandment (MANDATUM NOVUM) of love, that we are presented with in our Sunday's Readings.

In the Gospel pericope, Jesus answered that the greatest commandment of the law (Megale entole en to nomo) is to love God with the entirety of our being (De 6:5) and to love our neighbour as ourselves (Lev 19:18). To avoid confusion on who our neighbour is, the First Reading gives us a list of who they are: Strangers, Widows, Orphans, Poor People, and the Needy. The Lord made it clear that if we do not love them and they cry to Him, He would not be so kind to us. This is why the cry of the 6-year-old - Arthur Labinjo-Hughes, of Solihull, West Midlands, before he died in June 2020, that "No-one loves me and no-one gonna feed me", haunts me every day. Is it possible that in our parish, there are people who feel unloved and uncared for? Why not reach out to that parishioner you know nothing about and start off a conversation. May we never exclude anyone from being our neighbour and our love. Yes, we shall all be judged on love alone!!! Fr Johnpromise
