## MERCHANTS IN THE TEMPLE



In 2016, Gianluigi Nuzzi, an Italian Journalist and Author, published a book that rocked the entire world especially the Catholic Church — Merchants in the Temple. This book details the so many fights of Pope Francis towards clearing the Vatican and its Bank of financial corruption, manipulations and transactions, since his election as Pope. I was still discerning a call to the Catholic Priesthood when the book was published and a friend of mine in Rome ordered it, sent to me as a gift with this note - "Is this the type of Church you want to be associated with?" I read the book with an open mind but was troubled at some of the findings therein. I then remembered the words of Bishop Barron who at the time was still the Rector of Mundelein Seminary USA - It is when a house is on fire, that firemen are needed to put out the fire. Having found the above book an uncomfortable read, I resolved then to be financially transparent when I eventually become a priest. Yes, I know the Church still has a long way to go in this regard; I am optimistic we will get there with the help of parishioners keeping strict watch on our financial dealings.

In our Sunday Gospel, we meet the red-faced Jesus who could not stomach the merchants selling cattle, sheep, and pigeons, as well as the money-changers in the holy Temple of Jerusalem. In His anger, He scattered their trade and drove them away. Is it possible that Christ could do the same thing in our Church today? Are there things we do in our churches that have taken prominent position and even replaced God? I hope not! It is to counteract this, that our First Reading reminds us of the Decalogue which is summarised first in the Love of God and then the Love of our fellow men and women. That way, we acknowledge God as the one with the message of eternal life and never replace Him with anything else. Fr Johnpromise

HOLY SATURDAY MORNING: 10:15am & 11am - Blessing of Food at Holy Trinity with the Polish Community.


**HOLY SATURDAY NIGHT (EASTER VIGIL):** 8pm at Our Lady's, Fleet.
