

SERVANT OF THE SERVANTS OF GOD

One of the many official titles of the Pope is - Servant of the Servants of God. Around the 6th Century, John the Faster, became the Patriarch of Constantinople and before long, he started flexing his muscles. He arrogated himself powers that did not belong to him and even convoked synods to question the affairs of other Patriarchs. To assert his powers, John the Faster assumed a new title - Ecumenical Patriarch, which was reserved for and held by the Pope alone. To ensure nobody was in no doubt what the office of the Pope and all ministers in the Church must be, Pope Gregory I, took the title -SERVANT OF THE SERVANTS OF GOD. Since the 9th Century till date, that title has become synonymous with the Popes, and they have lived it out in various ways. It is this call to service and not to power/ authority that we are presented with today.

In the First Reading of this Sunday, all of us who are ministers of the Church in one way or the other, are called to place God at the centre of everything we do, instead of seeking for self-adulation and aggrandisement. The Gospel Reading shows us the perfect way of doing that which is by being the servants (**DIAKONOS**) for all. Yes, we are all called to be deacons/servants in the Church, since the office of deacons is that of service to all. Pope Francis summarised this in his homily at the conclusion of the present phase of the Synod on Synodality thus: "To love is to serve... There can be no true religious experience that is deaf to the cry of the world. There is no love of God without care and concern for our neighbour; otherwise, we risk becoming pharisaic. We may have plenty of good ideas on how to reform the Church but let us remember: to adore God and to love our brothers and sisters with His love, that is the great and perennial reform. To be a worshiping Church and a Church of service, washing the feet of wounded humanity, accompanying those who are frail, weak, and cast aside, going out lov-ingly to encounter the poor." Let us remember this crucial fact — There is no power and/or authority in the Church, all we have in the Church is SER-VICE, AND SERVICE ALONE. Fr Johnpromise



PARISH NOTICES

BAMENDA SUNDAY & RETIRING COLLECTION: This Bamenda Sunday finds us on the threshold of the 50th anniversary year of the formation of the link back in 1974, when Bishop Derek Worlock of Portsmouth met the first Bishop of Bamenda, Paul Verdzekov. They initiated the diocesan twinning as a response to the Vatican II document, Gaudium et Spes, which applied Scripture and the Church's Social Teaching to everyday life in the world, urging us to treat one another in a spirit of brotherhood - to look after and love one another. Many of you will be aware that since 2016 the anglophone provinces of Cameroon have witnessed appalling conflict between the armed forces and those opposing the government, resulting in thousands of deaths and over 700,000 people being displaced some fled as refugees to Nigeria, but thousands sought refuge in Bamenda where the Church has provided practical help with the support of Portsmouth and other charitable organisations.

In this year's **Bamenda News**, you can read about the Ntenefor Mission Station, where Fr Bernardine Nsom went to the new St Felix Church as Parish Priest on his return to Bamenda last October from Bournemouth. The population of the area has mushroomed with the influx of Internally Displaced People. The church is there for a Sunday congregation of 1,200 over two Masses and a small school for 300, which is grossly in-adequate for the 650 children now attending - there are 75 children in the nursery class and 97 primary children in just one classroom! So they need to build a bigger school; a presbytery; a hall; housing, offices and shops to generate rental income to enable the parish to become self-sufficient in the future - and to service it all, they need a borehole for a water supply and sanitation. I realise these are difficult times for all of us, however if you can make a donation, however small, we will ensure that every penny will go to support projects in Bamenda. Thank you very much!

Our collectors would be at the door with baskets to receive any financial help you can give to our twin diocese of Bamenda. Do give generously to this project.
